Authors are also kindly invited to **submit** their ready-to-publish papers to the **CIRET & Springer** <u>Journal of</u> <u>Business Cycle Research</u> (JBCY). Submissions accepted by the Editor-in-Chief will be peer-reviewed by two referees and published in a **Special Issue** of the Journal.
